Marshall County Schools Receives Rebate for Energy Program with Schneider Electric

Marshall County Schools received a rebate of nearly \$100,000 from the Tennessee Valley Authority for its energy savings performance contract (ESPC) with Schneider Electric

Marshall County, Miss. – March 1, 2016 – On February 29, Schneider Electric employees presented a \$96,330 rebate from the Tennessee Valley Authority to Marshall County School District. The District received the rebate as a result of its innovative energy efficiency program with Schneider Electric.

The District plans to reinvest the money from the rebate back into the learning environment, and continue its long-term growth and sustainability plan.

Marshall County Schools entered into a public-private partnership with Schneider Electric in November of 2014, to leverage the District's energy budget to fund much-needed energy and infrastructure upgrades designed to save money and improve the learning environment for its students. Notable improvements include HVAC replacements, interior and exterior lighting upgrades, and district-wide building automation systems. Thanks to the ESPC, all this was accomplished with no new taxes or increased fees to residents.

Installation of the ESPC was recently completed in November 2015, and will generate more than \$3.9 million in energy savings over the life of the project. Additionally, the project is expected to reduce the Marshall County School District's utility budget by 27 percent, saving more than \$147,500 in annual energy costs.

The project will have both a sizable environmental and economic impact on the local community. Once completed, the project will provide energy efficiency savings equivalent to removing 162 cars from the road, powering 97 houses or removing 754 tons of greenhouse gases from the atmosphere.
